

Your busing may change next year

Student Transportation Services of Thunder Bay provides transportation between home and school under the joint transportation policy of its member school boards. Each year, as new students enter the system, current students advance in grade and senior students graduate out, school bus routes and stop locations are reviewed and revised as necessary to address these changes as they relate to policy.

Next year, your student's eligibility for a school bus may change based on their grade and travel distance from their zoned school. Please familiarize yourself with the policy below for home to school distances for determining transportation eligibility:

School Bus Eligibility Distances

Distance from School

Grades

JK/SK: greater than 400 meters 1-3: greater than 800 meters 4-12: greater than 1600 meters

Transportation may be provided for students that have a pick up or drop off address within their school zone which is greater than the eligibility distance as shown above. If you live closer than the eligibility distance for busing for your student's grade, you are considered to be within the 'walk zone' and may no longer be eligible to be listed on a school bus route.

Students eligible for school bus transportation may also be required to walk to and from centralized school bus stops within set distances based on their grade with stop locations often based on the address of younger students in each area whenever possible:

Walk to Stop Distances

Grades	Distance to Stop
JK/SK:	160 meters
1-3:	400 meters
4-12:	800 meters

Ride a school bus day runs between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, August 27, 2022, outside the Confederation College McIntyre Building with two school buses, limited to 20 children per bus, departing every 30 min. Times must be booked in advance. School Buses will be cleaned and sanitized between tours. Only children will be permitted to ride the school bus.





Find your busing information online

Parents and guardians of students entering grades SK through 12 can access their child's busing information online. The safe and confidential Student Transportation Services of Thunder Bay's **Parent Portal** is an efficient tool to obtain your student's transportation information. The portal can be accessed easily and conveniently at **www.ststb.ca.** As JK students will not be assigned an Ontario Education Number until after they start school, Parents and guardians of these students will be notified of their child's busing information through their school.
